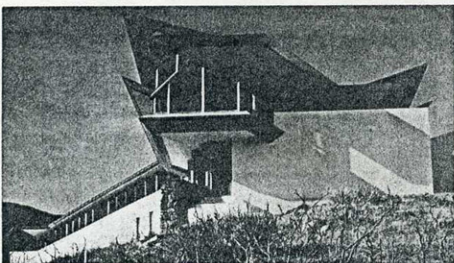








Haertling, Noble House.

#### HAERTLING A. Charles

Alcuni anni fa ad un concorso per case prefabbricate alcuni architetti associati presentarono come soluzione una tenda vera e propria, adducendo come spiegazione della loro originale soluzione, che lo spirito dell'uomo (americano) ha come tendenza di vivere a stretto contatto con la natura, non separato da essa da diaframmi rigidi, ma il più possibile elastici. A questo genere di soluzioni possiamo accostare la esperienza architettonica di Haertling.

Le sue costruzioni, per ora ville e chiese, si distendono nel paesaggio e si confondono con gli alberi come la Noble House e la casa Krueger, ottenendo questo effetto con la forma a tenda. Larghe falde triangolari partono da punti centrali di sostegno e giungono a conficarsi nel terreno, gli spazi liberi fra queste sono totalmente vetrati, e l'interno privo di pareti consente una più libera visione dello spazio circostante.

Sicché mentre chi guarda la casa dall'esterno ne coglie soprattutto il movimento dei tetti e da questi il suo sguardo è rimandato alla natura circostante, chi la abita coglie per prima cosa il valore delle vetrate, cioè è ancora riportato alla stessa natura.

Altre volte come nella casa del dottor Willard posta sulle pendici delle montagne rocciose in un paesaggio brullo e sassoso, non potendo trovare una ambientazione con la vegetazione, si è adeguato al taglio della roccia, ed allora i tetti si complicano, si frastagliano, si pongono su piani diversi, nella ricerca dinamica di analogie e risonanze.

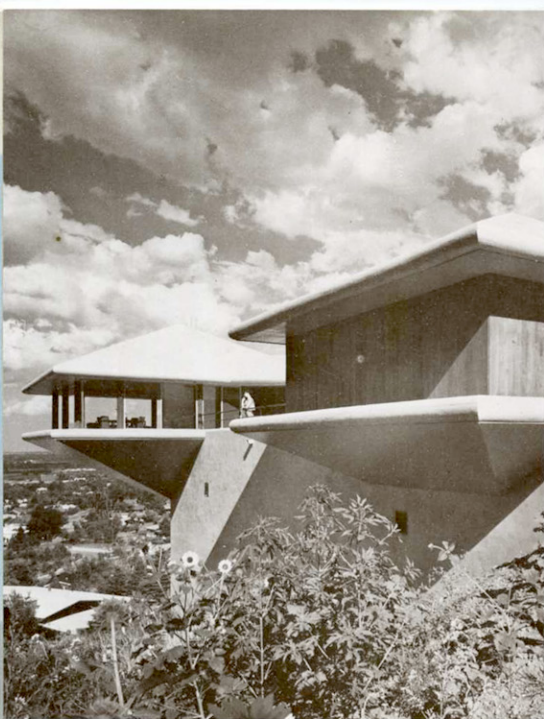
Caratteristica sua è appunto questa strutturazione dei tetti, nei quali trova la sua principale forma di espressione, e che determinano perfino alcune volte le soluzioni piantistiche.

Haertling è nato il 21 ottobre 1928 a S. Genoeffa, nel Missouri. Dopo aver partecipato alla guerra entrò nell'Università di Washington e vi si laureò nel 1953.

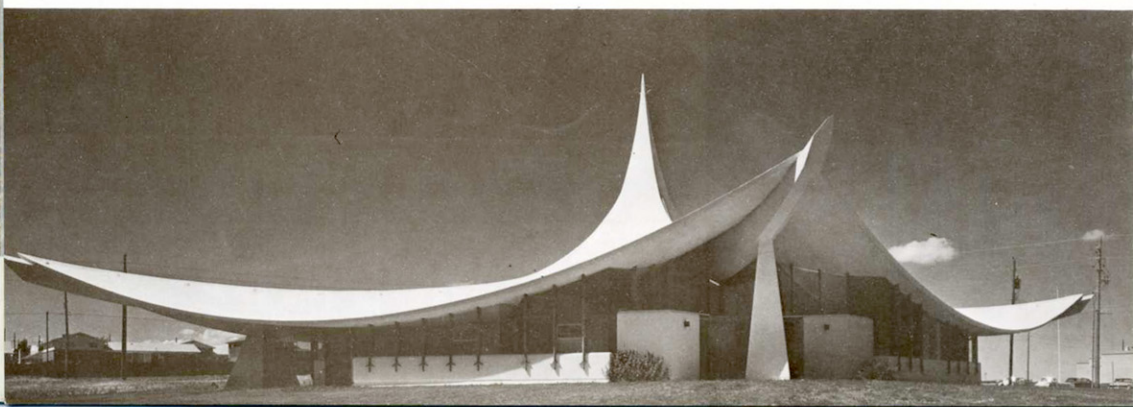
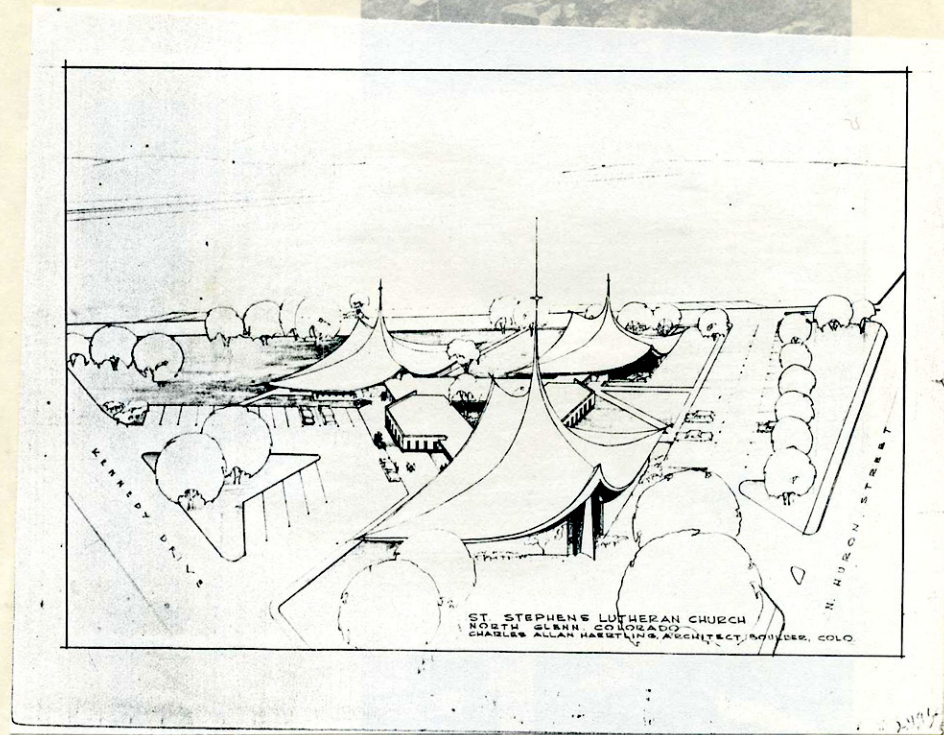
