

Alesis Fusion OS Upgrade and Screen Shot Information

1. If you have the OS only file on your hard drive (root directory) you can upgrade the OS from the Hard drive by following these steps

a. When upgrading from the OS only file from your hard drive you need to select the hard drive as the source not the CF card.

2. If you have a working Fusion you can create a copy of the current OS version in your Fusions ROM (or wherever it resides) and it will be copied to your hard drive.

a. When creating the OS only file on your hard drive you need to select the hard drive as the destination not the CF card.

Alesis Fusion Screen shot information

To make a screen dump of your Fusion's screen to your Fusion's CF Card press the **"Assign"** & **"T4"** buttons at the same time.

Something else I either forgot or did not realize is that when copying screen dumps (fusion_screen_shots) from the Fusion to your CF card

1. The screen dumps are automatically incremented with file name fusion_screen_shot_001, fusion_screen_shot_002, fusion_screen_shot_003, etc. which is good, But
2. If you remove the CF card to examine the screen shots be sure to save them on your computer before putting the CF card back in the Fusion to take more screen shots because your Fusion will automatically start all over with fusion_screen_shot_001, then fusion_screen_shot_002, etc. and your other screen shots will be overwritten :(
